

# God, Our Heavenly Father

### Part 2

## Introduction

In the first part of this study, we looked at some of the characteristics of the Father and His relationship to Jesus and us. In this part we will continue examining what the Bible says.

## **Our Study**

Jesus said that anyone who knows the Son knows the Father, that, in fact, they are One. Consequently, any of the characteristics the Bible attributes to Jesus, we can also attribute to the Father.

The Scripture: 1 John 3:1; Galatians 4:7		
" You are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, God has made you also an heir."

The Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said you."

The Scripture: 1 Corinthians 6:8	
In speaking to the Corinthians about their worship of idols, Paul said, "For us there is be the Father from Whom all things came and for Whom we live, and there is but one Lord through Whom things came and through Whom we live."

No one has ever said it better and more understandably.	
The Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15:24-28	
"Then the end will come, when he [Jesus] hands over the kingdom to God after he has a dominion, authority and power. When he has done this, then the Son Himself will be ma Him who put everything under Him so that God may be all in all."	•

Obviously, this is a very limited study of God the Father. Jesus said He and the Father are One, and whoever has seen Him (Jesus) has seen the Father. Reading the Bible and meditating on Jesus' words can give us a better and more complete picture of our heavenly Father. The point of having that picture is that we might worship the *true* God--the God of the Bible, and not the God of half-truths. Trust will be engendered as we see how good He is. Those who don't fully see God as good cannot trust Him. We are to believe Scripture over ...Satan's lies ...Our ignorance ...Our past experience with poor fathering.
